Subjects that can be covered during a visit:

Science

Scientific techniques and concepts. Discover and study plants, trees and minibeasts.
Collect and analyse data.

Numeracy and Maths

Use natural materials to make basic concepts more exciting.

Literacy and Language

Use the natural world for inspiration to communicate in a variety of styles.

Geography

Great environment to learn and practise map, compass and navigation skills.

Leisure and Tourism

Find out about our visitors, their requirements, the issues they may cause and how we manage these.

Art and Design

Stimulation for artwork in the wild or inspiration to take back to school.

Teamwork

Face new challenges safely; individually & in groups.

Conservation and Management

Discover what is being done to protect, manage and encourage the variety of habitats and the wildlife that lives here.

Physical Education

Physical challenges and being active in the outdoors.

History

Changing land use over time.

PSHE, PSHEE & Citizenship

Develop confidence & discover abilities & strengths. Take responsibility for themselves, each other, the environment and wildlife. Work individually and in groups. Manage risk.

Music

Experiment with natural materials to create sounds and explore rhythm and tempo.
