Holt Island is a beautiful green and tranquil space on the River Great Ouse close to St Ives and accessible to all. It is predominantly mature wet woodland (a rare local habitat), and a small area has been replanted with osier (willow) to reintroduce the traditional craft of cultivating and working with willow. The reserve has a circular boardwalk plus seating, and there are lovely views across the flood meadows and towards the town bridge.

The island is open at weekends and on bank holidays from April until September. It is located behind All Saints Church, The Waits, St Ives, a short walk from the bus station.
